MORE ABOUT GEORGE G. G. WOODY

A graduate of Abraham Clark High School and World War II Veteran, George was elected the first African-American Councilman in Roselle in 1957, where he served as Council President and Chairman of the Public Safety Committee was an organizer of the Roselle Branch of the NAACP, served as the Roselle Democratic Committee Chairman as well as the Union County Democratic Committee Chairman, making him the first African-American to be elected county chairman of either major party in the entire state. In 2016, the Borough of Roselle honored George with the Lifetime Achievement Award for his "many years of commitment, hard work and community service to the Citizens of Roselle."
